Celtic-Plus Call Process



Two calls per year

Spring call 2014

- Information Day in Oslo, March 03
- Proposers Day Monaco April 24
- Submission deadline:

15 May 2014


Labelling: mid June

Autumn call 2014

- Proposer's Day on June 25, in Berlin
- Submission deadline:

15 October 2014


Labelling: early December 2013





Proposal Success Rates

Why Celtic-Plus Proposals?



Advantages:

- Bottom-up proposals (no specific call text)
- Much higher success rate compared to EU programmes
 - · If strategies and advices are carefully observed
- Much less administrative overhead
- Much more flexibility
 - Modification of consortium, objectives, project duration.....

Challenges:

- Difficulties to synchronize funding agreements
 - May cause delay and/or require modification of consortium....
- Different funding conditions in countries, organisations



Advices to Proposers (1)



Before considering to write a proposal:

- Consider research items of the Celtic-Plus Purple Book
 - Main research items should be found there
- Carefully select your project consortium
 - Have all partners the necessary experience and recognition?
 - Are all partners from countries where funding is likely/ possible?
 - Check Celtic PA webpages; contact Celtic Office
 - Are the county involvements sufficiently balanced?
 - No country more than 60% of effort/ budget (at least 2 countries)
- Establish early contacts with PAs
 - Early checks for eligibility and partner funding can avoid failures
 - Nominate a national leading partner



Advices to Proposers (2)



During/ after proposal writing:

- Cross-check with national research programs
 - Is there sufficient national interest for funding the research topic?
 - Are there recommendations from PA for additional research?
- Explain <u>national</u> benefits expected from project
 - National gain in income, better positioning, new jobs
 - Why should a country fund the project?
- Submit a national <u>funding application</u> parallel to proposal submission
 - In some cases a provisional application may be accepted only
 - At least: try to get some confirmation about proposal submission
